Those stories intrigued him because they really happened — and they happened to people that were connected to him. While remaining faithful to known facts, he began writing fiction to add true life drama to the stories that would become The Westward Sagas, tales from colonial days to the settlement of the West. The first two books in the series, *Spring House* and *Adam's Daughters*, are available now, and *Book 3* will be released in the spring of 2012.

He is a member of several heritage and genealogical societies, as well as the <u>Tejas</u> <u>Storytelling Association</u> and the <u>National Storytelling Network</u>. He speaks to schools, churches, and other organizations. His presentations are both entertaining and educational.
